

Sussex School of Archaeology - An Introduction to Roman Britain

Dr David Rudling FSA will be teaching two similar introductory classes on Roman Britain, starting in the mid-1st century BC and ending in the 5th century AD, to explore over two terms (20 weeks) the archaeology and history of Roman Britain. Topics to be examined will include: the invasions of Caesar and Claudius, the army, client kingdoms, 'Romanization' / 'Becoming Roman', towns, roads, villas, farmsteads, trade, industry, religion and burial, and 'The End' of Roman Britain. Both courses will involve illustrated lectures, practical handling sessions of Roman-period artefacts, and visits to museums and archaeological sites in Sussex (and perhaps beyond).
