#### Dear CBA South-East members,

In wishing all our members best wishes for the New Year we look set to have another full and exciting schedule of activities and events in 2016. Our Site and Town Tours are currently being finalised and I hope that many of you take the opportunity to attend these events, building upon last year's success. We have also answered the call for more opportunities to learn about identifying and recording archaeological finds with the first series of training workshops which, this year, will focus on pottery analysis, and are being delivered by some of the top specialists from across the region. All CBA South-East members receive discounted access to these learning opportunities, and we will continue to run them in future years, with further potential workshops on animal bone, plant remains, and small finds in the offing.

Our annual conference on the Mesolithic held in November proved to be a resounding success. If anything it was too successful, with demand for tickets far outstripping what we had expected. A fascinating speaker line-up provided the backbone for the day. From Professor Martin Bell's illuminating keynote presentation on wetland archaeology to Don Henson's

highly engaging review of changing public perceptions, the audience were treated to a range of talks which really brought the Mesolithic (back) to life (see next month's newsletter for a more thorough write-up). We are also very thankful to Surrey History Centre and Surrey County Archaeological Unit for, not only providing an excellent and modern venue, but also the fascinating Mesolithic displays which really added some gloss to the day. A special mention must also go to the Prehistoric Society who very kindly supported the event financially by providing bursaries for five students. Delegates arrived from as far away as Manchester and Yorkshire, which just shows how wide-reaching the appeal of our conference went this year, and we are currently in the process of organising the 2016 event, which we hope will be even more successful. So please do keep an eye out!





A grant for £100 was recently awarded to the Lewes Archaeological Group towards the cost of isotope analysis for a number of burials found on Malling Hill. The remains appear to have been from an execution site. The burials were thought to have been associated with the Battle of Lewes, but Carbon 14 dating shows that they date to a much earlier period. The object of the new analysis is to determine whether the remains are local or from foreign climes, and possibly Viking. There will be a note in a future CBA South East newsletter once the results are known.
