

Grants are available to individuals starting out in archaeology as either amateurs or students which would include sixth formers or undergraduates to assist with the costs of various types of training, both practical and academic and to enable such individuals to gain experience in archaeological fieldwork and other forms of research in East and West Sussex. Grants are available for: short training courses (normally lasting from one to five days long, but sometimes longer) covering such subjects as surveying, excavation methods, environmental sampling, identifying, recording and interpreting finds, etc., day schools covering either practical skills or relevant academic information, attendance at relevant conferences or research projects which provide students and/or amateurs with expert supervision and some training.

Sussex School of Archaeology – Plumpton Roman Villa, Sussex: Excavation and Field School

Saturday, June 18th 2016 – Saturday, July 30th 2016

A training excavation at Plumpton, Sussex will include six 5-day Excavation Techniques courses. Each will provide a 'hands-on' and theory introduction to archaeological excavation, including: basic surveying and geophysics, excavation methods, written records, planning and section drawing, photography, environmental archaeology, finds processing and Health and Safety. This course is suitable for beginners, those with limited experience, A Level Archaeology students, people thinking of studying archaeology at university, and undergraduates. Tuition fees £150 per 5-day course. 1-day Saturday courses comprise: 'Taster' excavation days; Planning & Section Drawing; Total Station Survey; and Environmental Archaeology. Fees £40 per day. Volunteering opportunities (i.e. for those with some prior experience) are available from £25 for a 5-day week to a maximum of £50 for the whole season.
